Annual Candlelight Remembrance Service

November is a month of Remembrance. We celebrate the Feasts of All Saints, All Souls, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving and Christ the King. At Hope Church, November is the month when we remember our beloved friends and family members who have crossed the threshold between this life and eternal life.

Our Annual Candlelight Remembrance Service is held on the Sunday in November closest to All Saints Day. At three different places in the liturgy, names are read as family members come forward with candles, light them from the Christ Candle and place them on the Communion Table. With the growing number of lighted candles, the sanctuary increases in brightness until it is fully lighted, reminding us that the One who claimed to be the Light of the World - our Savior, Jesus Christ, is present with us.

Building Fund "Honoring our Debt"

Well three years are almost gone and our current "Honoring our Debt" campaign to cover our mortgage payments will be over with the receipt of gifts next June. The session has agreed with a recommendation from elder Steven Buckley that we discontinue the use of these three year campaigns.

Staring with January 2004 the church will provide 12 monthly envelopes for our continuing building fund mortgage needs and we will continue to use the phrase "Honoring our Debt". Everyone will get the 12 required new envelopes including those of you who currently have the old envelopes from the current campaign. For those of you with the old blue envelopes we only ask that you throw out the ones you currently have for the months of January through June 2004 and start using the new ones that we are providing to everyone. Marilyn Gifford our receipts treasure is gearing up right now for this new way of contributing to the "Honoring our Debt" building fund mortgage payments.
