# A CHRISTIAN SEDER DINNER Palm Sunday, March 20, 2005 At 5 P.M.

Downstairs in the John Calvin Room

Bring the entire family to participate in this Seder Meal that has been a ritual of tradition celebrated by Jews all over the world to commemorate the angel of death "passing over" those homes with lentils and doorposts that were marked by the blood of a slain lamb.

The "Feast of the Passover" was one of the highlights in Jesus' life during Holy Week. It was His last celebration of this Feast, and it has come to be known as "The Last Supper". This meal marks the beginning of our Christian celebration of the sacrament of Holy Communion.

The Hebrew term "Haggadah" means "what is said". "Seder" means "order of events". The Passover Haggadah is what is said, sung, recited, and enacted in this joyous celebration, and we will use parts of the Haggadah for our service.

There will be a sign-up sheet on the Welcome Desk in the Narthex. Each family is asked to bring their own plates, silverware, glasses, napkins, and one candle and candlestick per family. Juice and soda will be provided, and you may bring wine if you so desire. As in past years, the meat will be provided by the Committee, and each family will be asked to provide an accompaniment dish. When we know how many will be attending, we will be ready with your cooking "assignments"!

During this Lenten time of reflection, let us join together in this celebration that is so important to our Judeo-Christian heritage. Come learn the meaning and symbolism of the Passover Meal. It will truly be an experience to remember!

#### **Celebrate Spring with Dinners for Eight**

Waiting for sunny days and warmer weather? They're on their way, so it's time to make plans to get out of our winter cocoons. Rev. Cotton has shared with the Adult Ed. Committee a unique way for adult members and friends of Hope to reconnect through "Dinners for Eight", an opportunity for small groups to meet three times over the period of about six weeks for dinner and discussion. This program has maximum flexibility because each group of eight will select their own dates and types of dinners in each others' homes: take-out, covered dish, buffet, sit-down, or even pizza ! It's up to you! Sign-ups will begin March 13 with more information available during Coffee Time. At this time we estimate the program will run from early April through mid-May. Groups will be matched up with an eye toward geography, and of course couples and singles are welcome. Rev. Cotton will provide "kick-off" questions for each dinner, so no need to worry about what to talk about to get started. Please plan to get out and meet some new folks over good food at three dinners. This is a great opportunity to move beyond our picture wall and Sunday morning sightings to develop friendship and spiritual bonds within our Hope family.

#### **Mothers Group:**

The Hope Mom's Group continues to meet every other Tuesday at the Manse from 9:30-11:00. Together we are studying Proverbs 31, A Wife of Noble Character. Recently, the study has focused on the importance of being disciplined, diligent and enterprising. I have found this small group of moms encouraging and supportive in my role as a mother and a wife. Sharing common struggles and victories gives a sense of community among the mothers and motivates us to pray for each other and our families.

#### Youth:

The youth group meets every 2nd Friday of the month from 7-9 at the manse. The young people enjoy a time of fellowship, games, and studying The Word. We began studying the book of Matthew using this Gospel as a model of how to study other parts of the Bible. The kids are learning to look deeper for meaning, examine the context and understand the author and his audience. In addition to our regular meetings, we are beginning to meet one on one with some of the kids in efforts to get to know them better and have a more intimate time of discipleship. Finally, the group is hoping to attend a youth conference in Baltimore, Maryland, at the end of Spring and together we are seeking the Lord about making this financially possible for each youth member. Please be praying for the youth, that they would hunger for a deeper relationship with the Lord.

#### **Christian Surfers:**

The Lord has blessed our group of Christian Surfers. This group began meeting twice a month in Brick, but recently felt the Lord leading them to meet every week. Approximately 30-40 kids and adults attend the meetings every week to encourage each other in their faith. Most of the members are surfers, but it is not a prerequisite, as many of the non-surfers are there for the fellowship with others who love Jesus. The meetings consist of a fellowship, praise and worship, and time in The Word. The group is taking a day trip to Camelback on March 5th to snowboard and have some extended time together. Please be praying for this group as many new Christians attend, and our desire is for each of them to be planted in a church.

## **APPLE CAKE**

9 X 13 Pan, bake in 350 degree oven, 1 hour

1-1/2 cup Canola Oil2 cup Sugar2 Eggs2-1/2 cup Flour1-1/2 tsp Baking Soda1/2 tsp Salt1/2 tsp Cinnamon3 cups Apples - chopped1 cup Walnuts2 tsp Vanilla

Mix apples, nuts, sugar, oil and vanilla, Beat in eggs. Add flour, salt and soda.

Pour into greased pan and bake approximately 1 hour.
