It's Been A Long Time ... But PARISH NURSING is Active Again!

We're enthusiastic about informing you of a workshop we will be holding immediately after Worship on Sunday, March 19th in the John Calvin Room. We invite you to get your coffee and cookies and come prepared to think about the following topics. We'll help you walk through some of these issues that all of us should plan for and think about.

* For a Christian, a funeral/memorial service can be our last public statement of faith. Therefore, we want to make sure that our funeral expresses what we truly believe. * Will there be any kind of viewing? For some close friends and family members who did not have an opportunity to say 'goodbye', this may help them to have closure.

* What will be done with your body? Buried in the ground? Entombed in a mausoleum? Cremated? If the latter, you might want to give some thought to what you want done with your ashes.

- * What Scripture lessons do you want to have read?
- * What hymns/choruses/songs do you want to have sung?

* Are there prayers, poems, or other pieces of music that have inspired you that you would like to see incorporated into the service?

* Is there anyone in particular that you would like to speak at the service?

Remember that funerals/memorials are primarily for the benefit of the living, not for the benefit of the dead. If you want to give expression to your faith and bring comfort to your loved ones, we urge you to think about these things now and join us for the 'Christian Memorial Service Planning Workshop' after church on March 19th.

WHAT'S A DPNC?

You may have seen the bulletin insert that talks about the DPNC here at Hope. It's been a while since we originated the DPNC, and I thought you might want a refresher on what it is, what it does, and why it's necessary.

First, DPNC stands for "Designated Pastor Nominating Committee." This is the committee that, on behalf of the church, will conduct a search process to bring us a Designated Pastor to lead our congregation.

What's a Designated Pastor? Even if you've been a Presbyterian for many years, you might be a bit vague here. Although this position has been on the books for a long time, it's only recently that Designated Pastor has come into favor, and therefore more widespread use. A Designated Pastor is an interim position, like Interim Pastor, with two basic differences. First, the church and the pastor agree to a specific contract of two, three, or four years in length. The second difference is that at the end of the specified contract term, after a thorough search, if the church and the pastor agree, he/she can be called as the permanent pastor for the congregation.

What does the DPNC do? The DPNC at Hope has been in existence for over a year. Much of the preliminary work is completed, with the exception of the Mission Study, a process that leads the congregation through a period of self examination, asking them to look at where they are, where they are going, what kind of future they envision, and what kind of pastor will best lead them in that direction. Please pay attention to the bulletin insert and take advantage of the opportunity to add your voice to this process.

When the Mission Study is completed, all the necessary paperwork will be forwarded to the Presbytery, and we will be given the OK to go ahead and post our CIF (Church Information Form) – a kind of help-wanted ad for a Designated Pastor. Once that has been done, the DPNC will begin to receive PIF's (Personal Information Forms) – a kind of resume for Presbyterian pastors and candidates. The DPNC will look at all responses, narrow the list, interview several, have the favorite and the congregation meet, and prayerfully & diligently select the right person to lead us into the future God has in store for us.

Why is a DPNC necessary? The Presbyterian Church USA is very specific about the process required to call a pastor. We are accountable to the principles and processes of the PCUSA, and we want not only to do the right things, but also to do things right.

Why now? We're growing and moving forward. We need to look to our future and make choices now that will continue the process as we invite people in to become disciples of the Living Christ and then send them out to share Christ with the world.

What's your role? We have several vacancies on the DPNC right now. If you feel called to participate in this process, Hope needs you and your gifts. Please contact the Nominating Committee Chair Steven Buckley if you are interested. But there's a role for everyone, both members and friends. You will be asked to complete a survey and to attend one of two group sessions as we conduct our mission study. I hope you will be willing to stay a few extra minutes to join us in this important task. Your voice matters! Please take part as we move ahead, following our Good Shepherd, the source of all hope.
