## MESSAGE FROM THE STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

#### **One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS)**

The OGHS offering began more than 55 years ago in response to the devastation of World War II. In March 1949, a national broadcast on a Saturday evening asked Americans to give generously the next morning in their churches. More than 75,000 churches participated. The next year, the offering was repeated, using the name "One Great Hour of Sharing" for the first time.

In the Presbyterian Church (USA), the gifts received from the offering is divided in thirds. Each of three programs - Self-development of People (SDOP), the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA), and the Presbyterian Hunger Program (PHP) - receives 32 % of the offering, the remaining 4% goes to the PHP for its work on homelessness and affordable housing,

We are asking you to consider making a generous donation for the One Great Hour of Sharing. The offering will be collected in designated envelopes that will be available in the pews on Palm Sunday, April 9th. Church School children will be making their offerings in the fish banks that have been distributed in their classes.

In giving these gifts, we make the love of Jesus Christ real to thousands of people around the world. Let us thank God for this opportunity.

# WHAT'S HAPPENING WITH THE DESIGNATED PASTOR NOMINATING COMMITTEE (DPNC)?

The DPNC continues to meet and move toward the goal of calling a fulltime new pastor to lead the family of God at Hope Presbyterian. Your cooperation has enabled the committee to complete the church's Mission Study.

The next step is to complete the Church Information Form (CIF). It's the church's "Help Wanted Ad," to use a familiar comparison. The CIF tells something about our congregation, our strengths, challenges, etc. and tells what kind of pastor we're seeking in terms of characteristics, theology, skills, etc. Of course, the CIF also gives the salary, housing details, etc.

When approved by the Presbytery, Hope's CIF will be posted on a national website where seminary students and pastors looking for a congregation can go to find opportunities that fit their vision, needs, and calling.

Those seekers who feel as if Hope might be a good fit will send their Personal Information Forms (PIF's) to Hope. PIF's are equivalent to a resume that one might send to a company to apply for a job – only these are specific to the Presbyterian Church.

Please continue to pray that the Lord will bless this undertaking and lead us to connect with the right person at the right time!

#### MANSE MINISTRIES UPDATES

**Mom's Group:** The Hope Mom's Group began meeting again in January, and after a couple cancellations due to sick children, we are back up and running again. The group meets every 2nd and 4th Tuesday of the month from 9:30-11:00 at the Manse. Recently we have been going through the book Captivating by John and Stasi Eldredge. The book encourages women to seek after the heart of God rather than striving to please others or fit the mold of a perfect wife and/or mother. We are enjoying our study and have had some great discussions, which enables us to understand and pray for each other better.

**Youth**: Many of the youth in the church have been taking a confirmation class in preparation for becoming members and as a way to grow in their faith. The class meets once a month and is designed to present the fundamental principles of the faith and challenge the students to make it their own. Each student is required to memorized the Apostle's Creed and also develop his or her own faith statement, which will be presented before the body on Pentecost Sunday.

Much of what the youth is studying in confirmation class has carried over to our discussions in youth group; however, here we have more time for discussion and application in the kids' lives.

**Christian Surfers:** Christian Surfers continues to meet every Saturday from 5-7 at "The Garage" in Brick town. The group is growing and seeking new ways to meet the lost of the Jersey Shore. Recently, the group began to focus each meeting on something different in order to meet the various needs of the group. On the first Saturday of the month they show a surf movie and focus on outreach, on the second Saturday they do an alternative activity such as meet down at Manasquan inlet and evangelize, hand out Christian Surfer's stickers to the surfers on the beach or simply be available for people to talk and find out more about their group. And on the third and fourth Saturdays, they do a Bible study. Currently they are going through the book of John.

Please be praying for the group as they head into the summer months and focus on bringing more surfers to Christ. Also they will be taking their annual missions trip to Panama at the end of June. Please pray that God will bless this trip and the people of Santa Catalina as Christian Surfers looks to minister to this local community.

#### CHURCH SIGN PROJECT

For almost two years, Session has been on a quest to replace our old street sign with one that better suites our current Ministry needs. Pastor David had a vision for a sign that would pull people off Hope Road and get them to drive in. What he saw was an illuminated sign that would include a changeable message area, so that we would be able to advertise our outreach to the community. Elder Steven Buckley's task was to turn a vision into a plan. After several months of research, a supplier for our sign was selected. It is the Robson Corporation of Sarasota Florida. See their web site www.aqualitysign.com for information.

The session selected a design from their various options, and set aside \$10,000 from our undesignated investment funds for the project. Additional funding has also been received from the Gleaners and the Deacons. We now have permission from the Zoning and Building Department of Tinton Falls to finish the project and are waiting to get a delivery/installation date from Robson. The expected time frame for installation is by the end of June. If you're curious to know what our sign might look like, drive past the Methodist Church on Wyckoff Rd in Eatontown or the United Church of Christ on Hance Ave in Tinton Falls as they have similar sign to what we will have.
