Designated Pastor Nominating Committee (DPNC)

Our search process is over! Your DPNC has selected a candidate – <u>and he has said yes</u>!!!!!

The DPNC has sent all of the denominationally required documents to the Committee on Ministry (COM) of Monmouth Presbytery (MP) in preparation for its Tuesday October 3rd meeting and their approval of our candidate. The meeting is at 6:30 pm with our candidate and your DPNC at which time COM will interview the candidate and the DPNC to determine if they will recommend our candidate for approval at the Nov. Monmouth Presbytery meeting. **Please keep this COM meeting in your prayers!**

If COM concurs we can invite our candidate to preach at Hope with his "candidating sermon". After the Worship service there will be a Congregational Meeting when the congregation will actually meet our candidate and you can ask him questions. Next two votes will be taken. One is to consider accepting the person nominated to be our next pastor and the other vote is on the pastor's salary package, "Terms of Call". We will mail a letter to every voting active member to inform you of the date of this important day. We are hopeful that it's coming very soon!

These are exciting times here at Hope Church! The DPNC has voted unanimously to call our nominee to be our next pastor. We are very excited about the person we feel that God has led us to. Keep this entire process in your prayers. We promise to let everyone know the verdict soon after the October 3rd COM meeting and after the November Presbytery meeting! Lastly we would then schedule an ordination and installation service after which our new pastor would start all his pastoral duties.

Movie Nights at Hope

Did you miss *End of the Spear* in its limited release last spring? On <u>Friday, October 13</u> we'll be showing the film right here in our church at 7:30.

Based on real events, the film depicts the unexpected outcomes to our usual way of thinking after missionaries have a violent encounter with the isolated Waodani tribe of Ecuador, people who have traditionally lived and died by the spear. The film follows developments in the lives of tribe members and the missionary families through the next generation. This is a moving story of faithfulness, courage, and hope.

End of the Spear is rated PG-13 due to sequences of violence. The running time is 1 hour, 51 minutes. Please join us for this unique story, invite your friends, and join us for fellowship time afterwards.

On <u>Friday, November 3</u> at 7:00, the spectacular recent version of *The Chronicles of Narnia, the Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe* will be shown. This is a great opportunity to see this C.S. Lewis classic, if you missed it, or to enjoy it again. The story of four young children who stumble on a fantasy world while exploring an attic during a game of hide-and-seek. The film features state -of -the –art Disney special effects as the children ally themselves with the magnificent lion, Aslan, to battle the White Witch who has brought eternal winter to the land of Narnia. Come and cheer for the good guys in this epic struggle of good versus evil.

This film is rated PG and runs about 2 hours and 15 minutes.
