

Dear Family and Friends of Hope,

As we enter this advent season, allow me to share with you a couple of thoughts that have been mulling around in my head as I have been reflecting on the coming of Christ, and the meaning of Christmas. As I have been reading the first two chapters in Luke in preparation for the sermons for Advent, it strikes me that, surprisingly, we really are not that different from those who lived in Jesus' time.

By this I mean that, like the people at the inn in Bethlehem, we often have a hard time making "room" for Christ in our lives. Today's Christmas season tends to be defined by hustle and bustle, hurry and worry, visiting and vacationing, decorating the house and discount shopping. From "black Friday" to Christmas morning, between sending Christmas cards and wrapping presents, there very rarely is any time to stop and make space in our lives to reflect on the significance of Christ's coming.

And it's no wonder. After all, the events and ideas surrounding the incarnation seem so very distant and far removed from the "modern world" we live in. Amidst the many pressures of the season (family, financial, calendar), it can be hard to stop and hear the quiet knocking at the door of our hearts of one who is in need and asking for a room to stay in. And even if we do answer the door, just like the innkeeper in Bethlehem, it can be that much harder to actually take time from our busyness, and make the effort to create space for him.

Our modern lives demand so much, and seem so distant from the time of Jesus. And yet I like what Dorothy Day reminds us of, "It is no use saying that we are born too late to give room to Christ..."

"Christ is always with us, always asking for room in our hearts. But now it is with the voice of our contemporaries that he speaks; with the eyes of store clerks, factory workers, and children that he gazes; with the hands of office workers, slum dwellers, and suburban

## NEW PASTOR HAPPENINGS

Have you ever thought about how a pastor becomes a pastor? Aside, of course, from the obvious 3 years of study in seminary. That's post-graduate study, so when a person is graduated from seminary, they have earned an MDiv (Masters of Divinity) degree. But what about after that?

In the Presbyterian Church, a person has to have received a "call" in order to be ordained into the Ministry of Word and Sacrament after earning their Mdiv degree. A "call" is when a particular church extends an offer of employment to a person, and the person agrees to come and work at that church.

But there are some steps between receiving a call, and actually being installed as the pastor of a particular church. The candidate and the search committee must both meet with the Committee on Ministry of the Presbytery, to be questioned — mostly about theology and finances. If the candidate is approved by the COM to pursue a call from a church within its Presbytery, the next step is for the candidate to be approved by a vote of the congregation offering the call. The candidate next appears before the entire Presbytery of Monmouth, which is comprised of all of its ministers from the various churches and lay delegates, at a regularly scheduled meeting, to be examined as to his faith, his relationship with Jesus Christ, and his theological beliefs. The entire Presbytery must vote, then, on whether to accept the person into membership of the Presbytery, enabling the person to minister at a local church within the bounds of that Presbytery.

This is where we are at in the process!

On **Tuesday evening, November 28<sup>th</sup>**, Pastor Andrew will appear before Presbytery to be questioned. The meeting will be **at the Belmar Presbyterian Church** (very close to us!), starting at **7PM. The meeting is open, and we encourage everyone to attend.** If you don't want to drive there alone, or perhaps can't drive at night, let any Elder know of your desire to attend. We can set up car pooling, and we will make sure that you get a ride! Let's all plan to attend and support Andrew with our prayers and presence.

After approval by the Presbytery, the next step is the culmination of years of hard work and study and prayer. **Andrew's Ordination into the Ministry of Word and Sacrament and Installation as Pastor of Hope Presbyterian Church will take place at the church on December 3<sup>rd</sup>, Sunday, at 5PM. What a glorious event!**

This is a special worship service, with two components: ordination and installation. **Everyone is welcome at this special worship service, also!** A pastor is ordained only once (just as our Elders and Deacons are ordained only once), and we get to be there for Andrew's special event! And — we plan to have a super party to celebrate afterwards — downstairs in the John Calvin Room. Let's all plan to attend Sunday evening, and show Andrew and Robyn how very thankful we are for them and their decision to minister among the people of Hope!

### **Update from your Mission/Outreach Committee:**

Twelve prayer shawls were finished this week. They were dedicated during the November 19th Worship Service by Pastor Tibert. This group of shawls will be taken, together with notes of encouragement assuring the recipients of our prayers, to the Geraldine Thompson County Nursing Home Facility in the Allenwood section of Wall Township.

The Mitten Tree was set up on November 16th and will be in the Narthex until December 3rd. Please help to decorate it with a pair of new children’s mittens. They will be given to the Salvation Army in Asbury Park again this year.

## **The Clerk's Communiqué**

(Notes from the Session Minutes)

- **Administration:** A new church directory is being prepared for publication in the New Year. If you know of corrections that need to be made since our April 2006 version, please submit them to Gwynne Mahns.
- **Denominational Mission Budget:** The session approved a motion that our 2007 denominational mission budget be set at \$2,000.00. Half of that sum will be designated for Camp Johnsonburg and the rest for the general mission work of the Presbytery.
- **Local Missions:** The Mission/Outreach Committee will again be sending \$100.00 donations to support the work of ARC, The Parker Family Clinic, Inter Faith Neighbors and Coastal Habitat for Humanity.
- **Membership:** As of November 21, 2006 we have 117 active members with many new friends, who are not yet members, attending and taking part in our services regularly.
- **Music Ministry:** New members have been added to the Choir, the Bell Choir and the Praise Team recently. There's an open invitation for members of the congregation who are musically inclined to consider joining any or all of these groups.
- **Nominating Committee:** Thanksgiving was offered that all open positions for church officers have been filled.
- **Property:** Two dumpsters are sitting outside the manse and a large clean-up project is underway to remove unwanted and unusable items from the manse basement, the garage, the fenced-in dumpster area, and the shed. Many smaller projects, mostly at the house, will be accomplished in the next couple of months. In December, the gutters of the church and the manse will be cleaned out.
- **Stewardship:** Only about 50% of the expected Pledge Cards have been turned in so far. Extra cards are available from the Clerk for those who have misplaced theirs. The important point was made that everyone needs to be reminded of the fiscal fact that, because we now have a full-time pastor, the additional annual cost to us is approximately \$23,000.00. All congregants, - Elders, Deacons, members and friends of Hope, - are being asked to increase their giving so that our mission and ministry opportunities can be all that God calls them to be.

### **Hope Church 2006 Christmas Card Display**

Again this Christmas season the Deacons are asking members and friends of Hope Church to bring a Christmas card to the church to be displayed in the narthex for the holiday season. This will be done in lieu of our sending Christmas cards to others in the Hope Church community this year. Please bring your card to the church anytime between November 26<sup>th</sup> and December 24<sup>th</sup>.

The Deacons will then accept donations associated with Christmas card and postage savings, and these donations will be presented to Love INC. Your donation can be placed in the offering plate, and checks should be payable to Hope Church with a notation of "Love INC". Thanks in advance for your participation and support of Love INC during the holiday season.
