We each have our own special gifts and talents and together we serve for the good of all. Early in March Cyndie and I went to Kansas City for a stewardship conference. We were away for four days and during those four days many of you visited her mother in the hospital. This meant so much to Cyndie and I as Jane was in grave condition and to know that she wasn't alone during those days helped ease our minds. We here at Hope can be so giving of our selves it can be overwhelming at times.

I became a member of Hope Church in November of 2007, sometime after Cyn die. The biggest reason I waited so long was because I did not understand why it was so important to become a member of a church. Cyndie's family were members of Tower Hill when we met and got married. For the longest time her parents and those in charge of new members would push to have me join the church. I of course pushed back because of their tactics. When Cyndie asked me to attend church with her at Hope and later help with the finance committee, I did with the understanding that I wasn't joining the church, mostly because of the bad taste I had from Tower Hill. I will say that the congregation here was so open and welcoming, and not judgmental about why I was there and what I can do for them, that it made me realize what it meant to be part of this family.

I still had the question about what membership did for me and it was answered like this. Becoming a member of the church is a commitment not unlike marriage; it provides you the **privilege** of serving God and the community as a leader and an example to others. To not become a member could be liken to living together without being married. All of us here at Hope have the privilege of serving God, but beyond that we also have the privilege and responsibility of supporting His mission to the world. So I do not ask why commit to Hope but why <u>not</u> commit to Hope?

A Guide to Sacrificial Giving

As you look at your own sacrificial giving, keep in mind that your gift should be a share of your resources. Stewardship calls us to return a percentage of the blessings we have been given in our own lives. If you are currently giving 2% of your income, then perhaps this year you can take a step to 3%. Many people have found that the joy of giving comes from the experience of letting God direct their financial decisions. As responsible stewards, we are asked to make God a priority in all aspects of our lives. The story of the "Window's Mite" reminds us that it is not the size of our gift that matters as much as the act of giving.

The chart below is to assist you in this discernment process.

Don't Ask, "Why should we give?"

Instead ask, "Why should we not give?"

- First, we should give because we sincerely believe that God is the source of all our bless ings.
- Sacrificial Giving is one of the many things generous Catholic's do—not out of law, but out of love.
- When we give to God first we are making a gift of faith, trusting God will provide for our needs.
- GOD has blessed each of us with different kinds of gifts. When we combine our gifts together, we will benefit individually and collectively as a church.

Those who make such sacrifices in gratitude to God find that:

- 1. their own needs are still met,
- 2. they are more aware of God's love and care,
- 3. it is easier to distinguish between needs and wants, and
- 4. a sense of peace comes from knowing that their gift to God is no longer just what is left over or a contribution out of habit.

Remember that we are gifted by God; respond in gratitude.
