Dear Members and Friends of Hope,

Jesus said *"For where your treasure is there your heart will be also"* Luke 12:34. As we near the end of our summer vacations and prepare to return to a fall schedule including work, school and sports activities, I would like to take some time to bring everyone up to date on our mission's financial status.

Through the end of June our offerings have been just where we expected them to be. Not to say this isn't good, but what we projected our offerings to be still fell short of our purposed spending for the year. The difference through June of our offerings versus our spending was \$6,650. We had planned on having to use some of our savings to make up the difference through the year, and while this is not the preferred method of supporting our mission, sometimes extreme measures have to be taken. Unfortunately the summer months have been a different story. Our offerings have been down and the amount we have had to use from our savings has ballooned to nearly \$13,000. Our giving typically increases in the fall and will probably make up some of the difference, but without a **significant** dedication on our part, we will completely exhaust our savings by the end of the year. As for the Honoring our Debt fund which pays the mortgage the news is similar. Our offerings were just about what was anticipated, but the difference between that and our spending was \$2,300. Over the past few months that difference has grown to nearly \$3,500. I know these figures seem daunting, but as a congregation of God we shall come through this as long as we all commit to giving sacrificially, not because we have to, but because we want to in FAITH. Please take some time to pray about our financial situation and how you as an individual can help. Of course if you have any questions or concerns and just want to talk please contact me directly.

Are you being a 'good steward' of your Finances?

Are you a "good steward"?

In order to know if you are a "good" steward, perhaps a definition of "steward" is in order. Webster defines a "steward" as "one employed in a large household or estate to manage domestic concerns" (mainly related to money).

Think this doesn't apply to you?

In the book of Matthew in the Bible, Jesus talks about three men who were given money to manage for the owner.

One man, given the most to manage, went and found a way to double the amount his master gave him. The second man was given less to manage, but still found a way to double the master's money. The third man, however, given the least amount, was afraid of what his master would do if he lost the money... so to protect what he was given he went and buried it.

Upon accounting for their actions to the owner, both the first and the second man were rewarded for their efforts. The master said to each:

"Well done, good and faithful servant! You have been faithful with a few things; I will put you in charge of many things. Come and share your master's happiness."

For being fearful and not properly using what he was given, the master took the money the third servant had wastefully buried and gave it to a servant who had doubled his amount...then threw the "lazy" and "faithless" third servant off of his property.

What does this have to do with today?

For thousands and thousands of years, people have wanted to increase their possessions, knowledge, abilities, and experiences- and those who have consistently been able to do so have understood and applied a very simple concept.

Here is the clue...when you sow a seed of anything; you will reap a harvest of it.

We are HIS! Our place in this world is to serve as God's stewards on earth, and our responsibility is to manage God's "estate" and multiply whatever amount of anything God has given us.

Whether we are given most of time, talent, or treasures, it is our responsibility not to bury or hide them...we are to use them and invest them into those things that will not only multiply them, but in turn reap a harvest of eternal significance.

FORGIVENESS SEMINAR

It's pretty much part of the human condition that we carry scars from previous wounds received as a result of our interactions with other human beings. Perhaps it is betrayal that a spouse has inflicted on his or her partner. Perhaps it is a hurtful thing from a co-worker. Perhaps it is psychological damage inflicted from parent to child. Sometimes the hurt is intentional; sometimes it is totally unintentional. Whatever the cause, it is not easy for us to forgive the person who has hurt us. And sometimes we carry guilt about not being able to forgive in the ways we think we should. We know that we certainly do not forgive as God does: He forgives and forgets! And sometimes it is even hard to forgive ourselves whatever shortcomings or bad decisions we have made, because it is so hard for us to imagine how God could ever forgive us. We try to forgive, and it certainly is a process. Sometimes we may feel like we take 2 steps forward, and then slide 5 back. But one thing is for sure: unforgiveness does not hurt the person who has hurt us, it only hurts us. It can chew away at our insides, causing illness and more hurt and bitterness.

Beginning on **Wednesday, September 30th**, and continuing for 5 weeks, the Congregational Life Commission will be sponsoring a series of seminars entitled "Forgiveness Therapy: A Psychological Path to Well-Being". Each 90-minute session will meet at Hope Church. Topics will include what forgiveness is and what it is not, how to make choices in personal relationships to promote emotional and physical health, the mind-body connection and how it relates to the development of the habit of forgiveness, and emotional management skills to overcome negative feelings and promote intrapersonal stability.

The seminar instructor is Mrs. Mel Bennett. She is a NJ State licensed counselor whose practice interests are rooted in theories of Positive Psychology with a particular focus on Forgiveness, Gratitude, Optimism and Resilience. She currently works for the New Jersey State Commission for the Blind focusing on adjustment to blindness therapy and in a private practice in Sea Girt specializing in the treatment of anxiety disorders.

The attendance fee is \$15. per session, payable at the door. Participants are not required to share personal information while attending, and participants are free to come and go, attending one session or something less than all five. However this protocol has steps or components which serve as building blocks and so attendance at all sessions is strongly encouraged.

These sessions are open to all. We encourage you to share this information with friends, family, coworkers, whoever you think might be interested. And as we meet, let us anticipate God doing a healing in our midst through our seminar leader.
