Our Mission Statement

Finance Ministry Well after 6 months here is the financial status of Hope Church. Our projected in come for the calendar year is \$90,000 and we have received just over \$47,000 at the end of June, and an additional \$3,500 in memorial gifts. Our projected spending for the calendar year is \$111,000 and we have spent through the end of June only \$45,000. This has left us with a net of \$5,500 and no money drawn from our savings so far this year. Some of our savings have come from the lower cost of a part time interim pastor, limited church staff and lower utility cost for the manse. Some of these costs may change and increase in the future as we continue to look for our next called pastor and with ongoing changes in our musical staff, but we will monitor them closely and make adjustments as needed.

Property Ministry

In the first 6 months of the year we have made some needed repairs to the church, including new facets in the ladies' and men's rooms as well as repairing the toilet valves. A filter was added to the water line to remove any sediment which had been causing the toilet valves to hang up and not shut off. The front ramp and stair has had all of the cracks repaired and the handrail repaired. Some items which will need to be completed this fall are a full cleaning of the manse and painting the ramp and front of the church were the repairs have been made. Hope Now with Long-Term Rewards

"Since we are his children, we will possess the blessings he keeps for his people, and also we will possess with Christ what God has kept for him! For if we share Christ's suffering, we will also share his glory! I consider that what we suffer at this present time cannot be compared at all with the glory that is going to be revealed to us." Romans 8:17-18 (TEV) A Harvard study found that the more long-term your thinking is, the more successful you will be in life. And the more short-term your thinking is, the less successful you will be.

Unsuccessful people only think about the here and now – what feels good now, what is nice now, and what gives results now. But if you think in the long-term, you will have greater success, because you are willing to put up with short-term pain to gain long-term benefits.

The reason America is in the financial mess it's in right now is because of our inability to delay gratification. We don't know how to say no. We say, "I want it and I want it now, even if I have to charge it and can't pay for it," and the debt has caught up with us. That's what little kids do. They don't know the difference between "no" and "not yet." They have to have it now.

If you want God's blessing on your life, you must focus on the long-term, not the short-term. You can't allow hopelessness that comes from short-term thinking to take hold in your heart or you will get discouraged and give up too soon.

As Christians, we have the longest-term perspective of anybody – it's called eternity – because we know life doesn't end at death. We will transition to the eternal life which is going to go on forever and ever. So we live in light of eternity, not in light of current popularity, current comfort, and current conditions.

If you are feeling hopeless because of current struggles you are experiencing, keep in mind the words of the Apostle Paul: "[W]hat we suffer at this present time cannot be compared at all with the glory that is going to be revealed to us" (Romans 8:17 TEV).

In heaven, there will be rewards for you based on the stewardship of your time, money, talents, and the things that God put in your hands. Did you manage them well? Did you use them wisely? Did you live for the here and now with short-term thinking, or did you focus on the long-term and store up treasure in heaven?

My Agenda.

First of all, I will say that I have discovered Hope Church to be an amazing and surprising congregation. You have energy, you have youth, you have commitment, you have a deep faith, and you have a wonderful music program. Your leadership is upbeat and positive; plus, I noticed from my first interview that they actually seem to have a clue about where this church can go. This congregation clearly has a lot going for it. I am very glad to be here.

In my first few months with you we have celebrated a glorious Resurrection season together, and had an exciting session retreat in which we began to look ahead to some new initiatives. We have already had a number of baptisms including one adult, and we have received a whole bunch of new members. Most of this was in the pipeline before my arrival. It indicates a church full of life!

My agenda for my time at Hope will be centered on three things:

First, Scripture. I will be putting together at least one Bible study group this summer and fall, and I hope many of you will attend. The Bible is at the heart of who we are as Jesus' followers; it is in Scripture that we meet the Lord, and discerning his word for us has to be a priority as we move forward. I have also been sending out a Daily Meditation e-mail which includes readings from the lectionary for every day, along with an inspirational quote and usually a note about a particular figure from Christian history. (If you don't receive this, please let me know.)

Second, prayer. We have already had our first mid-week prayer service, centered on Scripture, some music, and a good, long time for prayer concerns. Next week we will hold a Healing Service, which I hope to do on a regular basis. Healing was the centerpiece of Jesus' ministry, and he gives his disciples a charge to heal as well. I hope Hope will be known in the future as a place for healing in the community. This emphasis on prayer should help us become more away of the presence of the Holy Spirit in our lives and world.

Third, evangelism. This is always a challenge for Presbyterians. There are several historical and other reasons for this, which I won't go into now. The message and Way of Jesus is good news for the world. "Evangelism"literally means "telling good news." Our ability to experience this good news in our own lives has to do with the quality of our life together as a gathering of Jesus' followers. At the same time, Jesus sends us out into the world on a mission from God, literally. That mission is to spread the good news of God's love for the world in Jesus Christ.

Obviously, there are other things I am doing as well. Pastoral care is essential; I have already been to three hospitals and one rehab facility. The worship service is always an important focus; I am already beginning to look at and plan for the Advent season and the Nativity. And finally we do have to pay some serious attention to stewardship this year. I'll have more to say on that as we move forward.

In terms of my office hours, I usually tend to be at the church on Sunday, Wednesday, and Friday, but this will vary from week to week. Please call if you need to see me. I work a lot from home, especially in the summer. I will happily make the 50 minute drive to meet with any of you.
