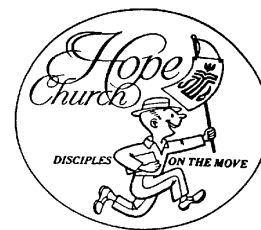

It has sensitized me to the needs of others, and helped me to resist the pull of our culture to do things that have no eternal value. That was my first experience of "stepping out" from the pews and being an active participant in the church.
